### SPIRITUAL OBJECTIVES

At the end of the sermon discussion, cell members will:

1. Reflect on the three charges Peter gave to the Church in the end times.
2. Take practical action steps to bless our local communities and/or the nations.

### SERMON SUMMARY

In 1 Peter, believers are taught to live victoriously in the light of persecution and to be ready for His second coming. From 1 Peter, Ps Joachim noted 3 charges Peter gives to the Church to live ready for the end times.

1. Pray Intensely ([v. 7](#))

- For believers to be mindful about the quality of our prayer lives – Prayer is crucial in our spiritual walk, let us take it seriously and to be watchful about what God is doing in our world.
2. Love Fervently ([v. 8-9](#))
    - For believers to be mindful about those around us and to consider how we can love others (especially those who have yet to know him).
  3. Serve Generously ([v. 10](#))
    - For us to use the gifts and talents we have to edify the church, to bless the poor and to advance the Kingdom.

Ps Joachim also shared about a RiverLife Missions initiative (#MissionfromHome) and encourages members to join a team or to support their fundraising efforts. Aside from overseas mission work, Ps Joachim also encouraged members who are interested to serve local communities to sign up for RLCares (details are in the Announcement section below).

## SERMON RECAP

*“If you read history you will find that the Christians who did most for the present world were precisely those who thought most of the next. It is since Christians have largely ceased to think of the other world that they have become so ineffective in this.” – C.S. Lewis*

The purpose of 1 Peter was to teach believers to live victoriously in light of persecution and to be ready for His second coming. Traditions recorded that the apostle Peter had to watch his wife’s crucifixion. It was recorded that he told her “Remember the Lord”. It also recorded that when the apostle Peter was to be crucified, he pleaded to be crucified upside down as he did not deem himself worthy of dying the same way as the Lord Jesus Christ.

How are we to live in the last days? We find the answer in [1 Peter 4:7-11](#). The greek word for “End” is telos - it is the idea of fulfilment, hope realised, and the realisation of all things that had been promised. Jesus expects us to be ready for the coming of the Lord. ([2 Peter 3:14 \[NIV\]](#) and [Luke 12:35-37 \[NASB\]](#)).

*“Every generation since then has lived in that same expectancy; the expectancy of the second coming of Jesus Christ. And to not do that is not to be a faithful Church.” – John MacArthur*

Ps Joachim noted three charges Peter gives to the Church to live ready for the end times.

### 1. Pray Intensely ([v. 7](#))

- The apostle Peter exhorted them to be serious and watchful in their prayers.
- How is our attitude towards prayer? Have we taken the importance of prayer lightly, or has prayer become something so routine that we do not care whether God answers our prayers?
- Pastor Joachim also shared the example of how the twelve disciples had fallen asleep in the garden of Gethsemane, against Jesus’ instruction to keep watch.
- We are exhorted to be mindful about the quality of our prayer lives, as our prayers determine the closeness of our relationship with God.
- *“You can go through the motions of devotions, but there is an erosion of devotion inside of you.”- Skip Heitzig*
- Many of us may have experienced feeling jaded due to the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on our walk with God.
- Pastor Joachim shared another preacher’s observation about dating and married couples. The dating couples are the ones engaged in conversations and actively spending time together. When we are in love, we desire to spend time talking to the one we love. Is this a befitting reflection to the relationship we have with God?

### 2. Love Fervently ([v. 8-9](#))

- Pastor Joachim picked out three key words from these verses

- “Fervent” in verse 8 means “strenuously” and would describe a horse at full gallop (in ancient times). It is also a descriptor for athletes who would give their all to run the race. We are encouraged to be proactive to love others with all our hearts.
- “Hospitality” is a New Testament word that literally means “loving the stranger in practical ways” – to be loving, compassionate, kind and generous to strangers, or people we do not know. It is embracing the fact that we are to love people outside of our normal circles. *“It is not only to open our homes but our hearts to them (strangers).”* – John MacArthur. These include the nations and the local communities in Singapore.
- Let us be mindful about those around us and to consider how we can love others (especially those who have yet to know him).

### 3. Serve Generously (v. 10)

- We have all been given gifts to edify the church, to bless the poor and to advance the Kingdom.
- Pastor Joachim shared about how God’s church is beautiful - she is a reflection of God’s beauty and love as we live out these three charges in a fallen world.
- *“When prayer is fervent, when love is preeminent, and when serving in prominent, then God is glorified, the Church is edified and the world is notified that God is real!”* – Skip Heitzig

In verse 11, Pastor Joachim also reminded us of the importance of serving “with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ.”

Through his preaching, Pastor Joachim shared about the struggles faced by the various countries and by the churches in the countries. The struggles include: people dying due to the Covid-19 situation, churches without a shepherd as the pastors were dying as well, children being sold as brides at a young age due to poverty and to cope with the pandemic issues etc. Pastor Joachim also shared encouraging stories about how MFH teams came together to intercede for the pastors and contributed financially to meet the needs of the people there. He also stressed the importance of doing prevention work – setting aside funds to practically address the needs of the nations. Members can consider signing up for RiverLife’s Missions initiative (#Missions from Home, MFH) – they can join a team or to support the various fundraising efforts.

Aside from overseas mission work, Ps Joachim also encouraged members who are interested to serve local communities to sign up for RLCares (details are in the Announcement section below).

God has blessed us so much – let our hearts break for what breaks His, and let us partner with Him in the harvest field. Let us ignite our prayer life, give generously, love the local communities and the nations!

## DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. **Pastor Joachim shared that we are in the end times. Do you agree with this? What are your thoughts / reflections as we see and hear what is happening around the world today? OR Share your experience on a mission trip - How was the experience for you as you worked together with other believers in reaching the lost and blessing the body of Christ? [10 Mins]**
2. **Pastor Joachim pointed out 3 charges in 1 Peter – to pray intensely, to love fervently and give generously. Is there a charge that you resonate with and desire to grow in?**
3. **Pastor Joachim spoke about Missions from Home / RLCares. Would this be something we as RiverLifers can consider for this season? If yes, which one will you be signing up for? If not, is there something else you feel led to devote your time towards?**



Consider dividing the group into micro-groups for a deeper time of sharing as well as praying for the following items:

**1. Sermon Application**

- For wisdom to discern and reflect on where we are in the race
- For God to grant us singlemindedness, zeal and fervour to pursue wholeheartedly after Him

**2. COVID-19 in Singapore**

- a. Pray against the spread amongst the various clusters.
- b. Pray that the spread of the Delta variant will be stopped as well.
- c. Continued progress in Singapore to overcome the negative economic and social impact of the current crisis.
- d. Pray for those whose livelihood have been directly impacted by this pandemic especially those in F&B.
- e. Pray for the mental wellbeing of Singaporeans as the disruption by the pandemic has affected many e.g. those in the education system etc.

**3. COVID-19 in the World**

- a. A swift end to the COVID-19 crisis globally, especially in India and the rest of South Asia.
- b. Healing and comfort for those who are sick and suffering.
- c. Protection and guidance for healthcare professionals at the frontline; giving them wisdom, courage, and strength to confront this crisis.
